Since its inception in 2009, Camaraderie Foundation has helped hundreds of families heal from invisible wounds through counseling services, ranging from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and marriage counseling to family engagement events and business networking – all towards a goal of easing the transition of military families back to civilian life. The foundation has offices in Orlando and Tampa and concentrates its efforts throughout Central Florida, the Tampa Bay Area and I/4 Corridor.
